Selah Pond's Will

I Selah Pond being of sound mind and memory do make this instrument of writing as my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows to wit

First I desire my funeral expenses are paid at \$1000 he paid

Second I give to my daughter Sally my front house one Bed and Bedstead one chair of back or knobs one Cuirlet one Kettle and two pillows all my things all my plantation tools and utensils all my Kitchen furniture and Cooking utensils one iron and Lamb and one corn and Calf to her and her heirs forever.

Third I give to my daughter Molly Pleasant one dollar to her and her heirs forever

Fourth I give to my grandchildren who are the offspring of my son Stephen Pond

des' collectively one dollar to them and their heirs forever.

Fifth I give and bequeath to my son John Pond one dollar to him and his heirs forever

Sixth I give to my daughter Rebecca Neworthy one young Black Cow by one man and her and her heirs forever.

Seventh I give to my son Richard Pond one hundred and one dollars to him and his heirs forever

Eighth I give to my daughter Policy Pond one dollar to her and her heirs forever

Ninth It is my desire that my grand daughter Martha Derry Pond shall have one Guinea 1750 one farthing in case she shall live with either of my daughters Sally or Rebecca or with both should they live together until she arrives at the age of twenty one years or if married in which ever other case I give her one Guinea and farthing forever But if she should die unmarried under twenty one years of age in that case I give the said Guinea and farthing to my two daughters Temperance to be sold and the money arising from the sale to be equally divided between them heirs

Tenth It is my desire that all my other property of every nature or kind not herein devised or given away shall be sold by my executor for the purpose of discharging my just debts and the balance I desire shall be paid to my daughter Sally to whom I give such remaining balance to her and her heirs forever

Lastly I constitute and appoint my son Richard Pond sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and disannulling all other Wills I have made
