¶ A Recount held for the County of Loudoun on the 15 day of November 1830
¶ This account of Sales of the Estate of Ebenezer Garrison deceased is to be recorded

To James Rechell Esq

Dee 1830 In the Name of God I Name & David St. Royston of the County of Loudoun and State of Virginia being Lived in this last of some mind and perfect memory think fit to make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following in Testimony where that my Executor shall sell to the highest bidder the rest of Land that I purchased of Martin Clumper for the purpose of paying off my just debts together with as much of my Chattel Plate as my debts may be think proper to give up for that purpose and of the proceeds of the sale of the said tract of land to be given what may arise from the sale of the Chattel estate that may be given up I shall not be sufficient for the purpose of paying all my just debts so as my will and desire that my Executor sell to the best advantage either for Cash or for so many of my negroes as may be necessary to supply the deficiency.

Item 1st I leave unto my Eldest wife Elizabeth the whole of the tract of Land wherein I now reside to use and cultivate as she may think proper together with all my negro stock of all kinds and Chattel estate of all description except as much as may be required for the payment of my just debts as aforesaid and my son John shall arrive at the age of twenty one years and if he shall marry before that time for the purpose and on condition that the said sons and executors my Last Executors namely John Margaret Martin & Eliza St. Royston. At condition my son John shall arrive at the age of twenty one years and every year and always in that case that a son right shall be allowed my Land with many negroes and the remains of the Chattel estate agreeable to the Laws of Virginia And clear for the plantation wherein I now reside asking as she has a single life at her marriage Only allowing a demesne right in the said tract agreeable to the Virginia Laws And the balance of the plantation wherein I now reside by my Last Executor And at the death of my Eldest wife Elizabeth plantation wherein I now reside sold to the highest bidder by my said Executor and the sale to be arising from the sale to equally divide among my five children above named & if there is further my wife and during the time my remaining negroes to equally divided among my five children above named the demesne excepted at the time of my son John arrives at the age of twenty one years to whom and their heirs forever.
