I, W. all men to whom these presents may come the first Exors Adors
 of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia be it remembered that
 memory to make and ordains this my last will and Testament in witness
 firm W.C. I leave unto my nephew John E. Peale during his natural life's time
 Yellowmy land 11 1/2 one tract called the Peale tract, being the same land formerly
 owned by Drury Peale deceased and purchased by me from Judge R. Drate deceased
 also six lots of Land purchased by me from the land of Thomas Peale which
 was divided into three portions of Land and the same amount of 1000 being apportioned
 by reference being had to said deed and in the files of the Office of the County of
 Southampton, also one tract of Land containing one hundred and one acres
 I purchased of Benjamin Whitfield it being a part of the tract called Whitfield
 which said Benjamin Whitfield held by a Deed from his father Peter
 Whitfield dec'd. But it is my wish and desire that should the said John E. Peale
 have and live or live hereafter together of his body for the said John E. Peale
 himself and his heirs forever to hold the aforesaid land to them and their heirs
 forever. But he the said John E. Peale do exist and have and lawfully
 begetters of his body, my desire is that the said land be equally divided
 between my sisters Polly Eliza Rebecca Peale and Lucy Fitzgerald
 them and their heirs forever. I also give unto my nephew John E. Peale my
 largest still one feather bed and furniture, my one day clock my wooden
 clock two with drawers three of his own choice of Corn and Cask
 two choice Lard and piggs my part in a negro man slave named Jack
 All the balance of my estate I wish to be sold at public sale and out of
 the proceeds thereof and with my money and Bonds which I may have
 after paying my just debts I wish my Exors Adors to pay to John E.
 Peale the sum of Twelve hundred dollars the balance I wish to be equally
 divided between my sister Eliza Peale Polly Eliza and Rebecca Peale
 to them and their heirs forever. And it is my desire and I do hereby nominate
 constitute and appoint John E. Peale Thomas B. Morris and James B. Hoff
 any two or either of them my Exors Adors to do my last will and Testament
 hereby revoking all other and former Wills by me herebefore made
 All this I witness I have hereunto set my hand and affixing my seal
 this 10th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
