Will

I Mitchell Williams a native of the State of Virginia and one inhabitant of the County of Southampton
do make and Ordain this last
last Will and Testament in manner and form to wit, as follows
1st I give and bequeath to my nephew Nathaniel Caughtry Son of Theophilus Caughtry one negro woman named Amy and the Sons of Thos. Howell to him and to his heirs and assigns forever
2^d I give and bequeath to my nephew Nathaniel Caughtry Son of Anne Caughtry the Sum of twenty five dollars to him and to his heirs and assigns forever
3^d I give and bequeath to my nephew Wm. M. Gardner the Sum of twenty five dollars to him and to his heirs and assigns forever
4th I give and bequeath to my nephew Samuel R. Gardner the land and plantation whereon I now live and the appurtenances thereto belonging, which is all the lands of which I am seised and adjoining the lands of William Lawrence, Uncle Eliza, Alfred and William, Elder and Son, Crumpley and others. I give to him and to his heirs and assigns forever
5th All the residue of my Estate of what nature and kind soever not herein before particularly disposed of I give to be equally divided between my first and second nephews Nathaniel Caughtry Son of Theophilus Nathaniel Caughtry Son of Anne, Wm. M. Gardner, Samuel R. Gardner and John Gardner share and share alike to them and to their heirs and assigns forever
Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint my Nephew Nathaniel Caughtry Son of Theophilus my lawful Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby authorizing and empowering all such and former Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made.
I Will the witnesses of I have thereto set my hand and affixed my seal this sixth day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and twenty nine. Signed sealed and attested to be my last Will and Testament.

I give and bequeath to my Son Wm. M. the following Slaves, Henry, Rebecca, John, George, George and Elizabeth the Son of Hannah, and the delicate furniture my table and two iron side tables and sugar trivet
I give and bequeath to my Son Robert the following Slaves and their future increase, the two black Smith's Cook and Betty with the black Smith's Cook, David, Moses, Jenny, and her four children, Louis, Matthew, Phoebe, Eliza and James Fanny and her child Eliza and Ellen and two boys with their furniture
I give and bequeath to my Son Edward the following Slaves and their future increase, Wm. young, Mark, Samson and her five children Louis, Eliza, Tom, Anna, Mary, and Edy the three now on the plantation and her young child which is with their furniture
I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza W. M. the following Slaves with their future increase
