Maries shall have my said Land and suchtame as before mentioned to her sonnes hechene ffreest. I also give to my daughter Elizabeth Maries, my neare mamy by the name of Newell, my neare weman by the name of Anna and my smallder neare weman by the name of Emma one of her bed and furniture and one blue chare to her sonnes her sonnes.

I<sup>d</sup>o my will and desire is that the Beaufiful Phillips remain for the use of her sonnes and her sonnes.

I<sup>d</sup>o my will and desire is that my neare weman by the name of Elizabeth told and the money arising from the Sale of the Land my wife shall be equally divided among my daughters Elizabeth Phillips Children except Eliz. Phillips - Her brother the Sapprent John Dwyer executors of my late husband John Phillips to have & to hold the same to satisfy my hundre and a ffeirdy shillings this 16<sup>th</sup> day of Octy in the Year of our Lord 1830.

I<sup>d</sup>o my will and desire is for the last will and Testament of John Evans in the presence of Emma Bangs, testifying <sup>as</sup> Elizabeth John Evans,

This last will and Testament of John Evans is made this day of the year of our Lord of Edward Dwyer and Elizabeth Evans his wife of the age of 80 years and 8 months and 10 days to be recorded at a Court held for the County of Hampshire the 17<sup>th</sup> day of October 1831. On the motion of John Dwyer the Executor there named to the said will and together with John Dick and Peter P. Penick his Trustees executors and administrators in the presence of John Thousand Dollars and demand of the law courts of justice grants him first sum a general discharge due from

Melior left, to Kilmead Robt of Southampton County and State of Virginia in being taken to y<sup>e</sup> plough for me mind and memory and I entighte my will that we and our family to die do work and continue this my last will and Testament Engle my stately field of all I possesse all my lands for my daughters to be paid one thousand dollars and my neare weman to my daughter Martha & Britto hundred and four hundred pounds and one thousand white shillings and bequeath to my son daughter Mary Ann Edwards one hundred pounds of Curing, and one hundred Pounds. Then I leave the residue of my property to be equally divided between my two daughters Temperance Daugther by the wife of Edwin Croftly and Charlotte Edwards the wife of James A. Edwards her brother and their heirs forever last above Sapprent and Temperance Edwards Daugther my wife and sole Executrix to this my last will and Testament as well the property land and Seal this 17<sup>th</sup> day of Octy in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and thirty one
