my seal this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of September 1831 in the presence of us  
William Griffin, Benjamin <sup>his</sup> Seal.

At Barnstable in the County of Barnstable the 21<sup>st</sup> day of November 1831  
After writing purporting the last Will and Testament of John T. Parent &c  
was produced in Court in Order to be proved and George W. Vaughan the Subsisting  
Witness thereto being dead Lindsey Atchinson came introduced himself and examined  
from whence testimony it appeared to the Court that the above-mentioned was written in well  
order Name thereto was wholly written by the said John T. Parent the Testator  
and that the hand of George W. Vaughan the witness was in the proper hand  
writing of him the said George W. Vaughan to have written the said writing established  
and ordered to be recorded at the last will and Testament of the said John T.  
Parent &c And on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October last Atchinson who made oath and  
together with John Dowry and Benjamin Atchinson his Sureties exhibited  
an acknowledge of a Bill in the sum of Two hundred dollars conditioned as  
the law directs certificate is granted him for 8<sup>th</sup> January 1832 of admittance
