 pot and dinner pot half a dozen plates first choice to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Eliza one feather bed and furniture one was being
 but I later fail I death even.

Item I give to my son John Lewis the bed that I lent to him and to my son's
 daughter of John Lewis my horse and gear and to them and their heirs forever and
 to my son Lewis daughter of Eliza one piece of cloth.

I will the balance of my Estate to be sold and after paying my just debt it to be equally
 set between the rest of my children namely John Lewis, Eliza Lewis and Elizabeth
 Turner and to their heirs forever.

I subscribe and appoint J. P. Nichol my Executor to the my last will and Testament
 revoking and making all others heretofore made by me null and void.
