and all of my property as far as every thing unto him and his heirs forever. I give also to
Sally, above mentioned, two hundred dollars unto her and her heirs forever. This being my last will and
Testament. Signed and delivered S. C. E. at the City of Virginia and State
of Virginia.

It is a good will for the County of Franklin on the 10 day of January 1839.

After Writing purporting to be the last will and Testament of Elizabeth Frances died
above mentioned to the Clerk of Probate and there being no Objection, Attesteth that we, John P. Williams
Abigail Davis and Anna P. Williams were Accurately known and do say that they are so well
accustomed to the hand writing of the said Elizabeth Frances and seeing, believe that
the copy of the said writing set forth as her Signature stands in the proper hand
writing of the said Elizabeth Frances. Attesteth further the Clerk being satisfied
with this, that the said Writing be recorded at and for the last will and Testament
of the said Elizabeth Francis die 8.

In the name of God & Amen. I, Rebecca Barham of the County of Southhampton and
State of Virginia being strengthed by abundant advice and good hope of God living in me
in the hope of a sound and perfect mind and memory do make and Ordain this my last
will and Testament in manner and form following (U.L.)

Firstly, my Will and desire is that all my just debts be paid, after that I hereby
discharge my Servant and Cook Case, my large looking Glass in the Hall
during her lifetime after that I give to my grand daughter Annelle C. Pease the same
Secretary and Book Case also the large looking glass her and her heirs forever.

Secondly, I give to my daughter Martha C. Barham my Portmanteau Steel, also the
fashioned which is on it together with the Contenperies, trinkets, the Sheets
and Curtains their belonging, also my Clock and Small Stained dressing Table toilet
and her heirs forever.

Thirdly, my Will and desire is that after all my just debts be paid the balance
of my property so much I have not disposed of to be sold if any and one half of the
money arising from such sale I give to my daughter Martha C. Barham to her
and her heirs forever.

Fourthly, I give to my son John Barham the sum of five dollars Cash to him and his heirs forever.
Fifthly, I give to my son Timothy Barham the sum of five dollars Cash to him and his heirs forever.
Sixthly, I give to my Son Joseph Barham the sum of five dollars in cash to him and his heirs forever.
Seventhly, I divide my daughter Nancy Pease one half of the balance of the estate of my property which
I have not disposed of after all my just debts be paid and to be paid out in small morsels of money to
be kept during her life time, and at her death I give it to my grand daughter Martha C. Barham to her
heirs.

Eighthly, I give to my Grandson Clement S. Clements all the balance of the money of my property which
she has, it being the other half of the balance and she should die before the age of Sixty five years
old to my daughter Martha C. Barham and her heirs forever.

Ninthly, I establish and appoint Michael C. Jones, Benjamin Williamson and Thomas P. Smith Executrix
to this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 17th
day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand Eighteen hundred and thirty One.
