Second. I leave the sole of all my Estate both real and personal to my beloved wife Festy James Rochester
her Natural life or until the death of the former of keeping my children and other family together
and advise and educate them, and after the death or marriage of my wife. It is my will
and desire that a division of all my other both real and personal be made among all my
living Children, Share and Share alike, to them and to their heirs as I specify hereinafter.

Third. I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Festy James Rochester to my
lawful executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and counterquitting
all former Wills and Testaments by me before made. In witness whereof I have signed
hereunto set my hand and caused my Seal to be affixed the Twenty third day of February
in the year of our Lord 1832. Signed sealed
