 wish to dispose of my Estate as follows

I first give and bequeath One chest of drawers to Elisha Pope Son of Abraham Pope
 and a black Calico frock with yellow flowers to Henry Johnson and also the linen
 of my clothing and other state whatever to Martha Pope the Widow of Elisha Pope
 and her Sister Sally Paulson ought to be equally divided between them two as they
 think proper and I hereby acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament
 this 19th day of May 1832 I hereby appoint Martha Pope to be my Executor to

 1832 This last Will and Testament of Mary Johnson dec^d was proved before
 Richard Boniste and Abraham Pope two of the Justices thereof and ordered to be recorded
 And at a Court held for the County aforesaid the 31st day of January 1833 on the Motion of
 Martha Pope the Executor therein named who made oath and together with Joseph
 Reese and William Pope her Securities entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the
 penalty of One hundred dollars Conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted
 for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form
