 the two items charged in the said Report of July 1826 and not returned were proper credits
 for him. Williamson Phillips and Gordon Barnes who are partners with the only daughter
 of the Testator were notified to attend this Office and from time to time failing to do so
 they each finally admitted the said items to be correct and by their instructions in writing
 to the Commissioners directed that the Executor may be allowed them without an account
