Imprimis. I desire that my Executors hereafter named may have my body buried in a

Secondly I send unto my friend Joseph Symer three Negro names Henry, Stephen and
Matthew during his life and his death to be returned to Peter Farrelle

3^d I send unto my friend John T. How, two Negroes named Isham and Patty w.
at his death they are to be returned to Peter Farrelle, also give to John How
two hundred dollars on Money

4th I send unto my friend Mr. Estbury Mason one Negro woman named Mary, during
his life and at his death to be returned to Peter Farrelle

5th I do give and bequeath to my friend D. C. D. Bacham, my Side board and a
furniture belonging to it.

Item I give and bequeath unto Peter Farrelle two negroes named Willard and
Lucy one bed & furniture &c.

Item I send unto my friend Joseph Symer one half of my tract of land where
I now live, during his life, I also give him one of my Cots

Item I give unto Peter Farrelle the other half of my tract of land

Item I give and bequeath unto Benjamin Camp and his woman named Ned
My desire is after my just debts are paid the remainder to be equally divided
Peter Farrelle, John T. How, and Joseph Symer. Should Peter Farrelle
die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years my desire is that his part of
the land shall go to Samuel May Jr, and his other property shall be equally di-
