And that the School Wardens of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being of their
 View and desiring Merits and Manners make and Ordain this my last Will and Testa-
 ment as follows To wit

1st It is my Will and desire that my plantation on which I now reside be sold by my Executors hereon after appointed & each of them upon such terms as they may think advisable and that they apply the proceeds to replacing the money that I may have expended out of the Estate of Robert Matthews dec^d in purchasing the same, unless I may have expended out of that Estate in any other way or to what purpose ^{thereof} may be due by me to said Estate at the time of my death. If my execs should survive me it is my desire that the above mentioned land be not sold till after her death but that she be permitted to enjoy the same during that life and also that she have a good and reasonable dowry daughter Eliza Woodhull during the lifetime of her mother or until my daughter Eliza shall marry.

I ^{re} bequeath to my Son John Muddell my Negro Man Andrew and his and
his wife all of which I have hereto fore given him and of which he has another
proportion also I give to my Son John my Negro Man Moses. Sales give to my son
John my Negro ~~Woman~~ ^{Woman} a Liddy and her youngest child Mary brickie Carter that
he pay the Sum of Two hundred dollars for the benefit of my daughter Martha P.
Chapman and her children on the manner hereinafter to be prescribed

3. I Conform to my daughter Dorothy at Beran such property as I have already but not her possessions except two Birds and furniture which I give to my grand children Mary and Joseph at Black. I also give to my daughter Dorothy at Beran my negro man Adam and my negro woman Ephraim provided she shall within three months after this will shall be proved and recorded release to my executors the sum of five hundred ~~dollars~~ Eighty Eight dollars out of her part of the money coming to her under the will of Robert Watkins dec'd. But if she shall fail to make the said release as above it is my desire that then my Executor's sell the said negroes Ephraim and Adam (Conditionally given to the said Dorothy as above) upon such terms as to them may seem proper and the proceeds apply as they are herein before directed in relation to the same when I am dead.

How do I send to my daughter Martha H. Chapman during her life some my Negro
man Isaac and also my tract of land in the County of Brunswick the same that I
purchased of her husband Alexander Chapman and descended in her said to my
