In Testimony I School Waddell of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being of sound
Mind and desiring Mind and Memory do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament
in writing as follows to wit

1st It is my Will and desire that my plantations on which I now reside be sold by
my Executors herein after appointed or either of them upon such Creditors as they may
think advisable and that they apply the proceeds to replacing the money that may have
expended out of the Estate of Robert Watkins dec'd in purchasing the same, and I may
have expended out of said Estate in any other way whatsoever may be required by me
to said Estate at the time of my death. If my wife should survive me it is my desire
that the abovesigned lands be not sold till after her death but that she be permitted
to enjoy the same during their lives and also that she have a home and residence for my
daughter Eliza Waddell during the lifetime of her mother or until my daughter Eliza
shall marry.

2nd I Confer unto my Son John Waddell my Negro man Andrew one Bed and
furniture all of which I have heretofore given him and of which he has now the
possession also I give to my Son John my Negro Man Moses. Also give to my da
Son my Negro woman Lippy and her youngest Child Mary Brice Christian that
she pay the sum of Two hundred dollars for the benefit of my daughter Martha F.
Chapman and her children in the manner hereinafter to be prescribed

3rd I Confer to my daughter Dorothy & Revan such property as I have already but not
her property except two Beds and furniture which I give to my grand Children Mary
and Joseph & Leslie. Also give to my daughter Dorothy & Revan my Negro
Adam and my Negro woman Sylvie provided she shall within three months
after this will shall be proved and recorded release to my executors the sum of
five hundred dollars Be it Eighty Eight dollars out of her part of the money amounting
more the wife of Robert Watkins dec'd. But if she shall fail to make the said release
as above it is my desire that then my Executors sell the said Negroe Sylvie and
Adam (conditionally given to the said Dorothy as above) upon such terms as they
may seem proper and the proceeds apply as they are herein before directed in relation to the
land wherein I now lie.

Item 4th I lend to my daughter Martha F. Chapman during her lifetime my 3rd^{1/2}
Man Isaac and also my tract of land in the County of Brunswick the same that I
formerly had of my husband Alexander Chapman and described in his last Will
Record in the Clerk's Office in said County and at her death it is my will and desire
that the said Negro Man Isaac and the said tract of land be divided between my
daughter Martha & equally divided between each of her children as may live
her. It is also my will and desire that the two hundred dollars to be paid by
