

I give to my wife Mary Donald Plant my negro woman Mary and her increase from this day, also my bedstead, beds and bed furniture not disposed of, all my table linen napkins and towels, all my Crochery, China and Stuf some of every description all my pewter, my Tea Spoons and Sugar Tongs all my knives and forks, a large Copper Stove and Silver Coffee urn, all my Cedar Caskets and Trunks and trunks four feet and six inches, all my Carts, One Ox Chain all my Ox yokes, all the meat land in fee simple use, a Sufficiency of Corn and feed for her use during the year it may be necessary I should die, all the liquor laid out for family use; also Ten binding Tons and the best of anything else we can procure enough to make provision for her family a year if so long there be, four work Hens the best, four other Cattle the best, all my Stock of Sheep, my looms and the apparatus belonging to them all my spinning wheels I could get them and wool, all the better land in fee simple use, all my ploughs and gear and seed six seedling hoes, six grubbing hoes, all my plough hoes, six Mules up to twenty three be first choice if not any number under that may be. I also give her my Carriage and Harness and the horse I bought of E. Waller, also my Kitchen utensils of every kind. I give her also all my household stuffs not before disposed of. I send her during her life my three Copper Stills, Cups and Worms, also a large iron Kettle for boiling Hogs I send to my wife during the minority of my sons William Henry Plant and Walter Fraser Plant, all my Slaves not given away except yellow John and a black son. I give yellow John to my son William Fraser Plant and a mulatto to my son William Henry Plant, to them and their heirs. I send my wife during her life all my land lying on the West Side of Buckhorn Swamp; the loan of the land and Slaves is intended for the maintenance of herself, William Henry Plant, Walter Fraser Plant, Simon Fraser Plant, and Angus and Frances Maria Plant. If any of the Slaves loaned to my wife Mary Donald Plant should become ungovernable or refractory. I desire that they may be sold by my Executor hereafter to be maintained and the amount of Sales to be divided equally between William Henry Plant, Walter Fraser Plant, Simon Fraser Plant, and Angus and Frances Maria Plant. When Walter Fraser and William Henry Plant become of lawful age they shall be each entitled to one fourth of the Slaves and their increase the residue to be kept to the use of my wife as my wife may choose for the support of herself and the support and education of Angus Simon Fraser, and Frances Maria Plant and that they divide the remaining Slaves and their increase may be equally divided between Angus, Simon Fraser and Frances Maria Plant, to be held by them and their heirs forever. At the death of my wife I desire the Copper Stills Cops and worms and the large iron Kettle for boiling hogs may be sold and the proceeds equally divided between William Henry and Walter Fraser Plant. All my land lying on the West side of Buckhorn Swamp at the death of my wife I desire may be sold either privately or at public Sale as my Executor may think fit and the amount be equally divided between William Henry Plant, Walter Fraser Plant, Angus and Simon Fraser Plant.

Whereas I have given off to my son James Reddy Plant and to my daughter Mary Elizabeth Pate and a Martha Pate some their full proportion of my Estate they are not to be considered as further entitled to any part of it. I Appoint Samuel Plant Executor to this my last Will and Testament.
