 Will In the name of God Amos. I Barnwell Branch of the County of Litchamption being
 ill and on my bed but of sound Mind and Memory. do think proper to make and Ordain this
 paper Writing as and for my last Will and Testament in manner and following (Wit)
 I Give I Give of the following property to my beloved wife Harriet Branch for and
 during her natural life (upon the condition that Will follow all my land also the fol-
 lowing Slaves, Lewis, Sims, Henry, Charlotte, John, Peter, Margaret, Julia and
 Evelina, also five head of horses the old Gray mare Bony the Gray mare Falesta the
 Tany Filly and the White Horse filly, all my stock of Hogs and Cuck of Cornfowls
 and Peas, also all my household and Kitchen furniture, except one feather bed and
 furniture which I shall hereafter dispose of here follow the condition that of my
 said wife Harriet shall and does keep all my daughters together with her and
 support and raise them as long she lives off of the property her name but if she dies
 I intend to do so then that each my child is that my wife receive one third part of my
 Estate for and during her natural life and no more.

I Give and bequeath unto my son Marmaduke H Branch at the death of his mother
 all that tract or parcel of Land known by the name of the Syffer plantation. I also give him
 at my death one Bay horse Belant and one feather Bed and furniture to him and his
 heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath unto my three eldest daughter namely Emma Marsh (I Give)
 Branch my three tracts of Land lying on the East side of the Round Hill Grange to
 be equally divided between them by three men made choice of by the parties (this property
 they are to receive at the death of their mother or when they may cease to be a member
 of the family of said mother, to them and their heirs forever)

I Give and bequeath unto my other six daughters namely Marianne, Dorothy, Elizabeth, Mary
 Martha and Polly Branch all the rest of the property which I have bequeathed to my wife (after her
 death that is not her share is to be equally divided between them and that share
 is to be affected by a sale of the property to them and their heirs forever)

I Give My Will and desire is that all the rest of my property of every kind whether
 ever not herein before disposed of be sold to my Executor and the proceeds thereof applied
 to the payment of my just debts and the surplus if any be equally divided between my then
 living children to them and their heirs forever)
