In the name of God Amos. I Barwell Branch of the County of Southampton being ill and in body but of sound Mind and Memory, do think proper, to make and Ordain this paper Writing as and of, my last Will and Testament in manner and following (Wit) I Give I send I devise of the following property to my beloved wife Sarah Branch for and during her natural life (upon the condition that Will follow) all my lands also the fol. Loring Slaves, Lewis, Ann, Henry, Charlotte, John, Peter, Margaret, Julia and Evelina, also five head of horses the old Gray mare Bony the Bay mare Felista the Tawny Filly and the White Horse filly, all my stock of Hogs and Crops of Corn, Peas and Tans, also all my household and Kitchen furniture, except one feather bed and two chairs which I shall hereafter dispose of here follow's the condition that of my said Will's Executor shall and does Keep all my daughters together with her and support and raise them as long she lives off of the property her named but if she dies refused to do so then it shall be as if my devise is that my wife receive one third part of my Estate for and during her natural life and no more.

I Give and bequeath unto my son Marmaduke H. Branch at the death of his Mother all that tract or parcel of Land known by the name of the Sypher plantation. I also give unto at my death one Bay horse called and one feather Bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath unto my three eldest daughters namely Emma Marsh (I Give) Branch my three tracts of Land lying on the East side of the Round Hill Branch to be Equally divided between them by three men made choice of by the parties (this property they are to receive at the death of their Mother, or when they may cease to be a member of the family of said Mother, to them and their heirs forever)

I Give and bequeath unto my other six daughters namely Marianne, Cathy, Elizabeth, Mary, Martha and Polly Branch all the rest of the property which I have named to my wife (after her death that is not her share) to be equally divided between them and that devise is to be affected by a sale of the property to them and their heirs forever)

I Give My Will and devise is that all the rest of my property of every kind whatsoever not herein before disposed of, be sold to my Executor and the proceed thereof applied to the payment of my just debts and the surplus if any be equally divided between my then living Children to them and their heirs forever)
