

3. I give and bequeath unto my Grand son John Cohen a certain measure of land or parcel of land containing fifteen acres be the same more or less it being the same which I have sold him and also to be laid off & given to the land that I sold to Joseph Cohen to him and his heirs forever.

4. I lend unto my daughter Mary Jones formerly Mary Grathney a certain measure of land or parcel of land containing one hundred and thirty acres be the same more or less for and during the term of her natural life and after her decease I give the same to be equally divided between her children to them and their heirs forever.

5. I give unto my daughter Julia Grathney all the Consanguinity that is in my possession at the time of my decease to her and her heirs forever.

6. After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses it is my will and desire that all my personal estate that I have not heretofore disposed of be equally divided between Jacob W. Cohen, Julia Grathney, Mary Jones and the heirs of William Grathney dec'd to them and their heirs forever.

7. I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my friend Jackson Story my sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and disannulling all and every other Will or Wills by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I Mary Grathney have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 14th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three.
