

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 15. day of November 1832.
This last Will and Testament of John Worrell dec^d was proved by the oaths of Benjamin Griffin
and Elizabeth Dwyer the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of
Say Worrell the Executor therein named who made oath and together with Benjamin Griffin
and Eli Joyner his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two Hundred
dollars conditioned as the Law directs. Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the
said Will in due form.

David Worrell's Will. In the name of God Amen I David Westbrook being weak in body but of sound and disposing
mind do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other Wills or
Wills verbal or written heretofore made by me.

Item 1st I leave and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Drew a piece of land formerly belonging to
George Stephenson viz all that part of the Stephenson plantation by my East of the Croft Lane
which I went from the land belonging to the estate of Sol Harris dec^d to the lands of Joseph
The land or if the contemplated new road should be established all the land East of the new
road which is expected to run near said fence.

Item 2nd I leave and bequeath to my sons Person, Sumner, and David all the balance of
my lands to be equally divided amongst them according to value. It is my will that the
houses in which I live should be allotted to my son David & that my sons
Person and Sumner should draw for the other two Tracts.

Item 3rd It is my Will that my sons in law A. W. Drew and Joel Harris should
return the negroes I owned them, to my estate and that an equal division by app-
raisement and allotment be made into five equal Shares of these and all the balance of
my negroes viz. I leave one share to my son Person one share to Sumner one to David
one to my daughter Lucy Drew and one to the Children of my deceased daughter Mary Harris

Item 4th I leave to my daughter Lucy Drew after my death three hundred dollars to her and
her heirs forever. I leave to the Children of my deceased daughter Mary Harris Three
hundred dollars to them and their heirs forever.

Item 5th It is my Will that the negroes allotted to and the money added to the Children of
my deceased daughter Mary Harris be placed in trust for them, each ones portion when he
is or they be come of lawful age or money in the mean time until such as not to be placed
it is my Will that the negroes and money be lent to my son in Law Joel Harris.

Item 6th I leave and bequeath to my three sons to be equally divided amongst them by appraisement
valuation and allotment all the balance of my estate horses stock of Cattle Hogs sheep farming
implements household and kitchen furniture together with all the balance of my estate not here-
before disposed of.

Item 7th I hereby nominate and appoint my sons Person, Sumner, and David my whole and
sole Executors to this my last Will and Testament, and it is my Will and desire that the Court
allow them to qualify without giving any security. Given under my hand and seal this 21st
day of October 1832.
