

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 18th day of November 1830.
 This last Will and Testament of David Westbrook dec'd was proved by the oaths of
 Robert T. Musgrave and Barnard Benfield two of the Notaries Public and ordered to be
 recorded. And on the Motion of the Executor named in the said Will who made
 oath and entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Fifty Thousand
 dollars (the Court requiring no Security) Constituted as the law directs. Certified
 granted them for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form.

 I give to Priscilla P. Simmons one bed and furniture to her and her family forever. I give to
 to Peter Simmons Jr. one bed and furniture to him and his family forever. I give to
 Elizabeth C. Simmons one bed and furniture to her and her family forever. I give to
 Jeremiah C. Simmons one bed and furniture to him and his family forever
 the balance of my property not given away is to be sold to pay my just debts and
 the balance if any I give to my wife Margaret Simmons to her and her family
 bed forever. I do appoint my wife Margaret Simmons my executrix to the
 my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and Seal this of first each day of August Eighteen hundred and thirty three
 Signed Sealed and delivered

in presence of us.
