

Samuel Pond's Will I Samuel Pond of the County of Southampton do hereby make my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following Viz

- 1st I bequeath to my Wife Anne Pond the use of my lands during her natural life and after the payment of my just debts I give her the balance of my personal property
- 2nd After the decease of my Wife I give my said lands to Edward Pond and his heirs five dollars to Richard Pond five dollars to John Pond five dollars to Mary Pond five dollars to Margaret Pond five dollars and to Charles Pond five dollars
- 3rd And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint John Dineen Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Affixed my Seal this 15th day of August 1839

A Court held for the County of Southampton the 20th day of January 1834
This last Will and Testament of Samuel Pond dec^d was proved by the oath of John C Pond and Wiley Joyner the Witnesses thereof and Orders to be recorded And the motion of Stephen L Pond (John Dineen the Executor named in the said Will appearing in Court and refused to take upon himself the burden of the Execution thereof) was overruled and together with Richard Kelle William C Pond and John Vick has since entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Fifteen hundred Dollars conditioned as the Law directs. Certificate is granted him for his return of Administration on the Estate of the said Samuel Pond with her Will annexed in due form.
