Sam'l Story's Will
In the name of God Amen I Samuel Story of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia hereby declare in body and of a sound and disposing mind and memory do hereby make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that to wit
First I give and bequeath unto my Sister Polly Story all my land and plantations with the residue containing by estimation three hundred and fourteen acres more or less to her and her heirs for ever.
2nd After my decease I desire that my funeral expenses and all my just debts paid out of my personal estate by my Executor herein after named.
3rd After the payment of my funeral expenses and my just debts I give and bequeath the balance of my Estate of every description to my said sister Polly Story to her and her heirs for ever.
Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint my friends John M. Guley and Thomas D. Worrell Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all other former wills and testaments by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal my said this 14th day of September. In the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty three.

Worrell the Executors named in the said Will appeared in Court and refused to take upon themselves the duties of the executorship who made oath and registered with Benjamin Story and Thomas M. Story their consent entered into and acknowledge as Oursers the penalty of fifteen hundred dollars
