

purchased from William Briggs by four hundred and fifty acres more or less one two and furniture and two hundred dollars in Cash. 9th Item I give to my son Thomas Pope half of my home plantation and half of the house and of my wife debt I give him the whole of the land. I lent to my wife also negro Abram and one bed and furniture 10th Item I give to my daughter Nancy Pope one negro boy William one bed and furniture 11th Item My Will is and my wish is for the balance of any property to be equally divided between Polly Henry Sally Ruth Dey Pope, Abille Pope, Peterson Pope, Nancy Pope and after my wife death what I have lent to her and not given away above is to be equally divided between those named in the 11th Item to be divided without share those men. I hereby appoint my son Nicholas Pope and Abille Pope my executor to this my last will and Testament revoking all former Wills by me made and do by this present acknowledge this my last will and Testament this 4th of the day of January 1834.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 15th day of September 1734.
The last Will and Testament of Henry Pope deceased was proved by the oath
of Richard Darden and Richard Barrett the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be
recorded. And on the Motion of Nicholas Pope One of the Executors therein named
(Mills Pope the other Executor therein named appeared in Court and refused to take
upon himself any part of the execution of the said Will) who made
oath and together with Mills Pope, Jacob Williams and Henry Knicker his
Deputies entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Forty Thousand
dollars conditioned as the Law directs. Certificate is granted him for obtaining
a probat of the said Will in due form

 ampton and State of Virginia do make and ordain this writing as and for my last
 Will and Testament in manner and form following To Wit:
 Item: I give and bequeath to my nephew Silas Draper (son of Jesse Draper) all of
 my estate of every kind whatsoever to him and his heirs forever.
 Lastly: I do constitute and appoint my nephew Silas Draper Executor to this
 my last Will and Testament, and request that he may not be required to give
 security for his Executorship. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal this 4th day of August 1832
