 well in body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory, do hereby be it thought God for the same as made
 and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say) First I give
 and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Polly Branch, his wife &c. the land and plantation whereon I now live
 with all my Stock of all kinds On negro woman (Agg) One negro woman (Anice) & One negro woman (Belle)
 One negro boy (Sharon). One negro girl (Marie) One do girl Charlotte, negro boy (Sharon) & negro girl Sallie
 with all their increase, for ever. I also give unto my Wife Polly Branch, his wife &c. One still full my house-
 hold furniture of every description whatever for ever. I also wish and request my negro man (Haley), my brother's
 plantation & Old place, slaves and Arms tract of land, to be sold to pay my just debts. Should any thing be left af-
 ter paying my debts out of the said negro man and slaves I wish it to be divided between Sallie & Branch
 and John Branches children, say one half to Sallie & Branch and the other half to John Branches
 children - And lastly, as to all the rest, residue and remainder of my personal estate, goods & chattels
 of what kind and nature so ever, I give and bequeath the same to my said beloved wife Polly Branch
 whom I hereby appoint sole executrix of this my last Will & Testament, hereby revoking all former
 wills by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 11th day of
 June in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine -

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 17th day of March 1835 -
 A Writing bearing date the 11th day of June 1829 and purporting to be the last will and Testam-
 ent of George Branch &c. dec^d was again produced in Court by Polly Branch for probat. Whereupon
 Henry Gray appeared by his attorney and opposed the proof of the said writing as and for the last will
 and Testament of the said George Branch &c. dec^d And thereupon Walter G. Biddle the undersigned
 witness to the said writing and sundry other witnesses were sworn and examined and the parties by their
 Counsel fully heard. On consideration whereof it is the opinion of the Court that the said Writing
 is the true last will and Testament of the said George Branch dec^d so far and so far only, as to prop-
 erty personal estate, that the Testator at the time of executing the said Writing was of sound and
 disposing mind and memory ^{and} was under no undue influence. Therefore it is ordered that the said
 writing be recorded as and for the last Will and Testament of the said George Branch &c. dec^d so
 far as to prop^{ty} the personal estate thereby conveyed.

 well make this my last Will and Testament (to wit)
 Item 1st I Give to my son Henry M. Biddle two feather Beds with furniture, and bed clothes to him and
 his heirs forever.
 Item 2nd I Give to my son George M. Biddle two feather Beds with furniture, and sixty dollars to
 him and his heirs forever.
 Item 3rd The residue of my Estate after paying my just Debts: It is my wish and desire shall be
 divided between my four sons to wit Edward A. Biddle, Henry M. Biddle, James J. Biddle and
 George M. Biddle to them and their heirs forever. In Witness whereunto set my hand and seal
 this 3rd day of January 1835
