Will

In the name of God Amen. I Mary D Blunt of the County of Southampton
and State of Virginia being weak of body but of sound mind and desirous
memory and failing to mind the uncertainty of human life do make and bearing
the My last Will and Testament. And first I give my soul to God who gave
it me and my body to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my
Executor.

Secondly I desire all of my just debts to be paid out of such of my personal
property, Crop &c. as in the opinion of my Executor can be best applied to that
purpose with advantage to my dependents.

Thirdly I give my spectacles to my daughter Rose McDonald Blunt.
Fourthly I give my riding Carriage and harness to my daughter Jane Claiborne.
Fifthly To the recovery and division of the lots in Petersburg to which I am entitled
to one fifth. I wish my just debts and then I direct my Executor purchase a
good silver Watch with a gold key and seal for each of my four sons Walter
William, Angus and Simon.

Sixthly All the rest and residue of my estate of Whatton River or descendants
give to my daughter Frances Marion Blunt but should she die & leave any
or Marry I then desire that the estate be equally divided between my two
sons Angus and Simon Blunt to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly I nominate and appoint my Trusty friend Augustus Claiborne Esq.
Administrator of this my last Will and I appoint him Testimentary Guardian to my
daughter Frances Marion Blunt. In Testimony whereof I have here set my
hand and seal this Eleventh day of March One thousand eight hundred and
sixty five.

Augustus Claiborne Not a Court held for the County of Southampton the 15th June
Ann Nicholson 1835. This last Will and Testament of Mary D
Blunt dec'd was proved by the Oath of Peter D Beckman and Ann Nicholson
two of the witnesses thereto and Ordained to be recorded. And on the motion of Augustus
Claiborne the Executor therin named who made oath and together with
William S Goodwyn John M Mason & William King Jr his Secretary informed
and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five Thousand dollars conditioned as follows
and certified a grantee having obtained a probate of said Will in due form.
