 in the penalty of One thousand dollars, conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted him
 for obtaining letters of administration, with the said Will annexed in due form.

 chest, large bed and small Table and wheel and when my son arrives to the age of twenty
 one I wish a division to take place between my two children. To this my last will and testament
 nothing all other Wills heretofore to be made. On which whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and affixed my seal this 24th day of March 1836.
