At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 17th day of October 1836

This last Will and Testament of George Atkinson dead was proved by the oath of Dor-
chester Devers and James Turner Ministers thereof and ordered to be recorded. And then be-
ing on Oath named on the said Will, on oath of Mearns (Mearns) who read with and together
with Matthew Daugherty and Benjamin Grogan his Securities entered into and acknowledged a bond
in the penalty of one thousand dollars, conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted here
for bringing letters of administration, with the said Will annexed in due form

Virginia being weak in body but of sound mind and memory as think proper to make this
Will writing as and for my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth to wit,
I give unto my son Osmond Bradshaw the large table and small bed and
small chest my land I wish to be equally divided and the ballance of my household furni-
ture and the money now which he is at work for I wish him to have and as soon as my
son Osmond Bradshaw comes to the age of twenty one I wish a division to take place a-
mong my two children

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Amy Bradshaw the following property, large
chest, large bed and small table and wheel and when my Osmond comes to the age of twenty
one I wish a division to take place between my two children. So this my last will and testament
revoaking all other Wills heretofore by me made. On the 15th whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and affixed my seal the 25th day of March 1836
