I Mourning Windham of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory do hereby make and constitute this writing to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, hereby revoking all former Wills or Testaments by me made.

Wit. 1st I desire that all my just debts be paid.

2nd. I give to my daughter Mary Adams fifty dollars & a spinning wheel & pair of better case & feather bed & some linen, with three pieces of furniture, my 2 better bed quilts & one sheet, and all my wearing apparel to her and her heirs forever. If my daughter Mary Adams should die with out an heir before of her own body, or should never marry for the part of my estate which I have left her I give the same to my son Benjamin L. Drew to him and his heirs forever.

3rd. I give all the remainder of my Estate both real & personal of whatsoever nature or kind it may be to my son Benjamin L. Drew to him and his heirs forever.

4th. I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Benjamin L. Drew my whole and sole executor to this my last will & Testament. One witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 13th day of June Eighteen hundred and Twenty three.
