Richard J. Darden.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 17th day of October 1836.

The last Will and Testament of Peterson Pepe and was proved by the oath of Richard J. Darden a Notary Public and continues. And at a Court held for the said County 21st day of November 1836, the same Will was fully proved by the oath of Richard Darden, a Notary Public, and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Jacob Williams, the only Executor named in the said Will, who made oath and together with Richard Peter and George Battle his securities, entered into and acknowledged as true in the presence of these thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs, herofore is granted him for drawing a protest of the said Will in due form.

In the name of God amen. I Elias Edwards of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, do this Edward the 17th day of October 1836 make this writing my last Will and Testament as follows, to wit,

Item. I leave to my beloved wife, Margaret Edwards, one negro girl Easter for and during her natural life. I also give her fifty dollars in money. I leave her (my wife Margaret Edwards) one third part of my lands and Plantation and one fifth part of the balance of my estate after paying my just debts for and during her natural life, and at her death, my desire is that all the property that I have left to my wife except the same be equally divided between my four children (viz) William Edwards, Elias Edwards, Sarah R. Edwards and Warren Edwards.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son William Edwards two thirds of my lands and plantation at my death and at the death of his mother the other one third, which includes all my lands, on the condition that he pay to my son Warren Edwards, the sum of four hundred dollars, to him and his heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elias Edwards, one negro girl Hannah, and one hundred dollars in money, to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah R. Edwards, one negro girl Anna, and one hundred dollars in money, to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Warren Edwards five hundred dollars in money, to him and his heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Eliza A. Vaughan one negro girl Lucy to her and her heirs forever.

My Will and desire is that all the balances of my Estate not heretofore mentioned be equally divided between my four children (namely) William Edwards, Elias Edwards, Sarah R. Edwards and Warren Edwards to them and their heirs forever. My wish is that my friends James D. McFenney, William A. Sparks and John Moore divide my negroes between my wife Margaret Edwards and my four children as within named.

Lastly I do nominate and appoint my son-in-Law Allen Edwards and my son William Edwards the Executors to this my last will and testament, revoking all other Will's by me heretofore made. Given under my hand and seal this 17th day of October 1836
