I give and bequeath unto the children of Mr. John C. Mason the other half of my estate, to them and  
their heirs forever. And if my wife should die without issue of giving the whole of my Estate to the children  
of Mr. John C. Mason to them and their heirs forever.  
If my wife should have issue, and they not live to the age of majority, I give the whole of my Estate  
to the children of Mr. John C. Mason.

I nominate and appoint my friends Nathaniel T. Williams and John G. Mason executors to this my  
last Will and Testament. Signers sealed and acknowledged in presence of & dated this 11th day of Decem-  
ber in the year of our Lord 1836.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 19th day of December 1836.

This last Will and Testament of Richard Mason deceased was proved by the oath of John Drury and  
James Edwards, the Notaries Public, and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Nathaniel T. Williams,  
one of the executors herein named, who made oath, and together with John G. Mason and Nicholas Edwards  
his brother, entered into and acknowledge a bond in the penalty of Fifty Thousand dollars conditioned  
as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form. Liberty  
is reserved the other Executor to join in the probate as a future day.

if she marries then to have her thirds of the land left to her.

Item. It is my will and wish that my wife out of the proceeds of the estate go to my two sons John  
Cooper Gray & Philip Francis Gray the last reservation her means will about of & at proper age they be put to  
such profession as seems best suited to their capacity.

Item. I will that my lands in Illinois be sold & kept as it may seem best in the judgment of my  
Executor for the benefit of my two sons aforesaid, John Cooper Gray & Philip Francis Gray.

Item. I appoint my friend James P. Morganhart the guardian of my two sons John Cooper Gray & Philip  
Francis Gray.

Item. I appoint the said James P. Morganhart Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking  
all other Wills & Testaments heretofore made by me. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal  
the 8th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.
