

it reported that it was settled agreeable to Brookens, and owing to the lapse of time since the settlement was made - it being more than 25 years, - it is the opinion of your Commissioners that all the items in that account should be admitted as younger suing ancient: and in the settlement of the following account they are allowed except such as have been discharged or falsified.

The last item against the estate was a judgment recovered by motion on the 16th of April 1864. It appears there was an execution in the hands of the Sheriff against Theodore and Jefo Brown his son & wife and the amount collected of Brown, soon after which Brown moved against the Representatives of Theodore and recovered judgment for the amount thus paid by him as security. It appears to your Committee since that this item and Items No. 1, 5 & 83 (which were for blacks tickets due before the death of Theodore - he having died in 1804) as well as Item No 3, 8, 9 & 19. Should be classed as simple contract debts no evidence being produced to show whether Item No 19. was for services rendered before or after the death of the testator. Items No 12, 13, 20 & 31 were distinctly after Items No. 22, 27, 29. & 30 & 44/50 of item No 26. were judgments rendered by a single Justice: no evidence was produced to show the date of these judgments nor the quality of the claims upon which they were rendered. Item No 32. was the cost of a judgment recovered against the Representatives for a debt due from the testator. Item No 16. The writer desires upon its face that this account was discharged by the sale of a negro boy Jacob and as the estate is not creative for the sale of the Negro it should not be charged with the account. Item No 20. It appears from an endorsement made on the original account of debts, and admitted to be in the hand writing of James Jones the exoner. that an negro Amos sold by the Sheriff to satisfy the executions in favour of John Clayton and sold for \$7.95 to that the present amount of the executions. If the Estate is charged with the amount of the Executions it ought to be creative for the amount of sale of the Negro.
