

Southampton County, State of Virginia. I William Kitching of the aforesaid County do hereby make my last Will & Testament in manner and form following to wit:

1st I give unto my father Ethelred Kitching, two hundred and twenty dollars, annually during his life, the same to be paid by my executors as necessity requires.

2nd I give unto my wife Nancy Kitching, the following Slaves, namely, Polly, Fanny, and Pleasant, to her and her heirs forever.

3rd. I leave unto my wife Nancy Kitching during her natural life the revenues of my Slaves.

4th I give unto William & Williams the Tracts of Land I bought of Peter Barber and James McNeill to him and his heirs forever.

5th It is my will and desire that the lands that I obtained at the death of my Grandfather William Hines and my Grandmother Susan Hines, be sold at the death of my father Ethelred Kitching

6th It is also my Will and desire that all of my property which I have not mentioned above be sold to pay my just debt, and if the property be sold my just debt should not be sufficient, it is my will that the following Slaves or Slaves should be sold, namely, Martha and white Slaves namely

7th At the death of my wife Nancy Kitching it is my Will that the Slaves which I have bequeathed shall be equally divided between Amanda C. Foster and the heirs of Gilbert Dickey by her present Wife.

8th I constitute and appoint William J. Sobrell and Nicholas M. Sobrell, my executors, born under my hands and seal this 29th day of November 1836

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 16th day of January 1837.

This last Will and Testament of William Kitching aforesaid, was proved by the oath of Jonathan L. Simmons and Nicholas Ellis the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of William J. Sobrell, one of the Executors therein named, who made oath and together with Nicholas M. Sobrell and Jonathan L. Simmons his securities, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Ten thousand dollars, conditioned as the Law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form. Nicholas M. Sobrell, the other executor named in said Will, appeared in Court and refused to take upon himself any part of the burden of the execution thereof.
