In the name of God, amen: I Jelley blauds of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia, being through the abundant mercy of God with in body, and of sound mind, and perfect memory do make and retain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following: I first recommend my soul to the Almighty God who gave it, and my body to be buried in a Christian-like manner to the discretion of my Executors, hereafter mentioned, and as to worldly goods, it has pleased God to bestow on me what in this life, I dispose of them in this following manner: I do hereby give to my son William blauds, one dollar, also I give one hundred dollars to be equally divided among my four children namely Milly blauds, Rebecca blauds, Mary Ann blauds, Jesse J. blauds, also it is my wish and desire that all the balance of my estate should be sold and equal divided among my living children except William blauds.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Philip J. blauds my Executor to this my last will and Testament. As Witness I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this thirtieth day of October eighteen hundred and thirty six

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 20th day of February 1837.
