In the name of God. amen. I Jelly blaud of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia, being through the abundant mercy of God with in body, and of sound mind, and perfect memory, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, To-wit: I first recommends my soul to the Almighty God who gave it, and my body to be buried in a Christian-like manner to the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, and as to worldly goods, it has pleased God to bestow on me whilst in this life, I dispose of them in this fellow-
ing manner To-wit, 1st It is my Will and desire that all my just debts should be paid, and after that I give to my son Williams blaud, one dollar, also I give one hundred dollars to be equally divided among my four children namely Milly blaud, Rebecca blaud, Mary Ann blaud, Jffer J. blaud, also it is my wish and desire that all the balance of my estate should be sold and equal divided among my living children except Williams blaud.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Philip J. blaud my Executor to this my last Will and Testament. As Witness I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this Thirtieth day of October Eighteen hundred and Thirty six
