Harrison Parker
Will

In the name of God, amen, I Harrison Parker of Southampton County State of Virginia, being but
health but of sound and disposing mind do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner
and form as follows.

First. I give to my Wife during her natural life one half of the land tract of Land taking
that portion adjoining the Bratt tract also the Bratt tract, the tract purchased of Herring J. Smith,
and a small piece purchased of Harrison Bell. I also give her two Negro girls by name, Jenny and
Sarah during her life, but should she prefer to have them sold she may do so, taking in view of the am-
ount for which they may sell in few simple. I also give to her and her heirs forever one bay Horse, two
driv^t bays and one year's provision.

Ind. I give to my son Dawson one negro Boy by name Henry to him and his heirs forever.

Ind. The residue of my estate I wish sold (with the exception of my lands in Southampton County
not already disposed of and which I give to my son Dawson. one third of the amount arising from the
sale of my perishable estate I give to my Wife. The remaining two thirds together with that arising
from the sale of my Negroes after the payment of all my just debts I give to my son Dawson
Parker to him and his heirs forever.

1. The pieces of Land which come by my Wife dying Estate I wish my executors, here-
after to be named, to have sold and request that my Wife will make the necessary deed to the pur-
chaser. The money arising from the sale I give to my son Dawson. I constitute and appoint my
Friends Herring J. Smith, Matthew Vaughan and Harrison Bell my Executors.
