At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 20th day of March 1837.

Mason and Susan Shephard, his daughter, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of ten thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, bond for the same is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of said John Shephard dead with his said Will annexed in due form.
