First I give to my friends and relatives Nells Pope all of my land lying in the County of Southampton to him and his heirs forever.

Second I give to my niece Mary Elizabeth Nicholson daughter of Richard Nicholson one hundred dollars to be affixed to her education.

Third I give to Virginia A.D. and Frances Rebecca Pope daughters of Spotsley Pope deceased one hundred dollars each of them and their heirs forever.

Fourth After paying all of my just debts I give the whole of the balance of my estate to Nells Pope to him and his heirs forever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th day of April A.D.
