

At a Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery held for this County of South Hampton the 1<sup>st</sup> day of April 1835. The last Will and Testament of John M. Bond as aforesaid was proved by the oath of John Savage, John A. McCall, and Benjamin B. Bond the 11<sup>th</sup> of the said month and ordered to be recorded and in the motion of Matthew Bond and John Exum the executors thereof named who made oath and together with Edward Dault, James Clayton, James M. Bond, and Allen Edwards their securities (each justly sworn to their sufficiency according to law) entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Ten Thousand dollars and secured the said executor, Collector and grand Juror for obtaining a probat of said Will in due form—

That all men by these presents that are Settlers of Edwards August an Andrew Edwards Dault John Johnson and Samuel B. Bond are held and firmly bound unto Settlers Henry and Thomas of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the first and full sum of Three Thousand dollars to be paid to the said Bonds and his Successors for the Ten-shanty to which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators jointly and severally jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated the 19<sup>th</sup> day of Octo 1835. The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above named Settlers of Edwards hath been by the Court of South Hampton County this day appointed Clerk of the said Court for and during the term of some years next ensuing. And therefore if the said Settlers of Edwards shall duly and faithfully execute his Office of Clerk of the said Court during his continuance therein and shall not remove or carry or suffer to be carried or removed out of the said County of South Hampton the records and papers of the said Court or any part thereof except in case allowed by law then the above obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue Signed sealed & acknowledged in

- ✓ I John Williamson of the County of South Hampton do make and contain this piece of writing to be my last will and testament in manner and form following
- Item I lend to my sister Winifred White one tenth part of my Negroes and the plantation whereon I now live and the tracts of land over Ten acres and at her death I then lend all of the property above named that can be found to John C. Summerville his life
- Item I lend to my sister Polly Branch one tenth part of my Negroes and the road plantation formerly called Saviors and at her death I then lend all of the property above named that can be found to John C. Summerville his life
- Item I lend to John C. Summerville the balance of my Negroes and a tract of land formerly called Williams tract also a tract of land formerly called Harbors and one horse his choice and at his death if the laws of our land will suffer it I then wish for the Negroes to be sold
- Item I give to my friend John D. Swain the sum of twenty dollars to him and his heirs forever and now I wish all of my stock and animals to be sold and to pay my just debts and if there should not be enough taken that can be spared his and if there should
