 Will

In the name of God Amen: I Lydia Rollings of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, being of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament as follows, To-wit:

1<sup>st</sup>. I give to my son Robert B. Rollings all my lands and plantation to him and his heirs forever.

2<sup>nd</sup>. I give to my son William A. Rollings the sum of Three hundred dollars

3<sup>rd</sup>. I give to my grand-daughter Sarah Elizabeth Frances Hill the sum of twenty dollars and one feather Bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

4<sup>th</sup>. I give to my grand-daughter Martha A. Hill the sum of twenty Dollars to her and her heirs forever.

5<sup>th</sup>. I give to my son William A. Rollings one work steer to him and his heirs forever.

6<sup>th</sup>. It is my will and desire that my negro woman Lucinda be sold by my executor hereafter named, and the money arising from such sale pay William A. Rollings the sum of three hundred dollars mentioned in the second clause of my will as above and to Sarah Elizabeth Frances Hill the sum of twenty dollars mentioned in the third clause and to Martha A. Hill the sum of twenty dollars mentioned in fourth clause.

7<sup>th</sup>. It is my will and desire that all the balance of my estate not given away should be sold by my executor hereafter named on a credit of twelve months, taking bonds with approved security.

8<sup>th</sup>. It is my will and desire that the proceeds of the sales of my estate be equally divided between all my children namely Patrick A. Rollings, Jese A. Rollings, Mary A. Hill, & William A. Rollings and Robert B. Rollings to them and their heirs forever.

9<sup>th</sup>. I constitute and appoint my friend Edwards Butte my executor to this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this 9<sup>th</sup> day of April 1852.
