Will

I, Harriet Whitehead, of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia,
being in perfect senses and memory, do hereby make my last will and
testament, in manner and form following, viz:

1st I give to William H. Nicholson of the aforesaid County the sum of one
thousand dollars to be raised out of my estate for the special purpose
of his purchasing (and fitting) up a suitable place for a parsonage, a place of
residence for the Pastor in charge of the Southampton Church, which
property is forever to be appropriated to that use and purpose as
long as the Methodist Episcopal Church shall remain a regular or-
ganized church.

And I give to my brother Joseph B. and John Whitehead,
the remaining part of my estate to be equally divided between them.
It is my request if William H. Whitehead should live to the age
of twenty one years my brother John should pay over to him the sum
of two hundred dollars out of his part of my estate.

Lastly, I hereby constitute (and ordain this to be my) last will and
testament and do hereby invoke and annul all other wills heretofore
made by me. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this the first day of June 1852.
