In the name of God, Amen: I, Elizabeth A. Little of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia, being feeble of body, but of sound mind do publish this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows, To-wit:

Item 1st. It is my will and desire that all of my just debts be paid out of my estate by my Executor who I shall hereafter proceed to appoint as soon as convenient after my decease.

Item 2^d. It is my will and desire furthermore that my s^d Executor proceed to pay out of money arising from the proceeds of my estate the following sums as mementos of regard & friendship, to-wit: to my niece Virginia B. Brown the sum of twenty dollars to my esteemed friend Phoebe Rollings the sum of twenty five dollars also to Peter Ann Peterson the sum of twenty dollars and to my relative M. A. M. Bates the sum of ten dollars to them and their heirs forever.

Item 3^d: It is further my will and desire that my plantation be kept up during the natural life of beloved daughter Margaret A. E. Wishten, that all of my slaves as sufficiency of stock and every thing necessary to keep up the plantation be reserved for that purpose and further that such things as shall not be necessary for the keeping up the plantation shall be sold by my s^d Executor as soon as he may think best after my decease.

Item 4th It is further my will and desire that the money arising from sale of such surplus of my estate with all due me after the payment of my
