In the Name of God, Amen! I, Simeon Murfee do make and publish, let
the following be my last will and testament.

First. I give to my beloved wife the sum of five hundred dollars to her & her heirs
lives, to be paid to her immediately after my death.

Second. I leave to my wife and my son Edward to Murfee jointly to remain together
and undivided during the life of my wife the following property, all my Lands lying
on the north side of the road leading from Jerusalem to Springfield, Slaves, Hensel,
Elisha, Esther, Hamet, Melly, Sheba, Anne Mary, 2 Horses (called Salt & Peppery
(red) carriage & harness, 2 Yoke of Oxen, all my Sheep, 6 choice Cows, 50
choice hogs, 50 Bushels of Corn 2000 lbs of Bacon, Fodder, all the eat
left of the present year, Bacon enough to serve her family one year, 2 Carts
Complete of choice Coughs, 4 Geese, Two Mill & Corn Sheller, and all my
household Kitchen furniture of every description.

Third. After the death of my wife I give & bequeath to my son Edward Murfee
all the land and other property learned on the foregoing claim except the slaves
in them I dispose of the following manner: Mary Ann Hamet I give to my
son Edward, and the other slaves mentioned in the said second clause to be
equally divided between my children James, Mary, Eliza, Amable and Maria.
Fourth. I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary the Lot of Land
at Franklin and Rosetta & Child Harrieta to her and her heirs forever.

Fifth. I give and bequeath to my son James the following Slaves Anthony, Fanny
& Phial, also a small tract of Land called Calico or Daughans old place containing
about 60 acres, to him and his heirs forever.

Sixth. I give to my daughter Eliza a negroe man named Stephen and an infant
negroe named Selas to her and her heirs forever.

Eighth. I give to my daughter Harrieta negroes Nancy and her child Company
to her and her heirs forever.

Ninth. I give to my daughter Anna negroes Maria and her child Jacob to her
& her heirs forever.

Tenth. I give to my daughter in Law Josephine Murfee all the interest which
I own in the estate of her deceased Father, Joseph Currier (and which I bought of
Edward T. Murfee & wife, to her and her heirs forever.

Eleventh. I give all my books of Every description to be equally divided
between my sons James and Edward.

I direct that the Lands and other property not hereinbefore disposed of be sold
by my Executor and the proceeds together with all the money on hand and
due me be equally divided between all my children. I appoint James
H. Murfee, my Executor.

It has been my anxious desire in this will to do right and I invoke my wife
& children to be satisfied with what I have done.

If any of the female slaves mentioned in this will should have any children born to them
during my life, I wish such children to pass with their mothers.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 18th day of March 1855
