I Jefso Parker of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia being weak in body but of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows:

1st. I give to my daughter Martha Williams two negroes Regis and Mary and their future increase, one bedstead, bed and furniture, half a dozen windsor chairs & one Tin safe, which she has already received; also one bedstead, bed and furniture not received.

2nd. I give to my son Richard Parker the sum of fifteen hundred dollars already received, also two thousand five hundred dollars, which I have paid for him, also one bedstead, bed and furniture half a dozen windsor chairs and two negroes Mineral & Taylor - I also leave to him for and during his natural life the following negroes, namely Elias, Louis, Sam, Jerry old Anthony, Lymus, Nelson, old Mary, and Marcello and the future increase of the females, and one bedstead, bed and furniture not received; and at his death I give the aforesaid negroes & furniture to be equally divided among all his then living children -

3rd. I give to my Son Jefso Parker two thousand nine hundred and forty five dollars which he has already received; also I give him the following negroes namely Tom, Henderson, Eliza Adeline, Belinda, Anna, Little Anthony, and Billy and their future increase of the females, also two horses; one bedstead, bed and furniture already received, and one bedstead, bed and furniture and one eight day Clock not received. Also I give to my Son Jefso Parker the land and plantation with the appurtenances including the Mill and fixtures, wherein I now live, lying between the Cedar Swamp and the Cypress Swamp, and bounded by the road leading from South Dury to Monroe Ferry: said road being the Northern boundary line from the Cedar Swamp to a Post at a ditch thence up and back to the line of the Carr tract of land, thence along the Carr tract to the Cypress Swamp, and bounded on the south west by Gibleton Morris line -

4th. I give to my daughter Sarah Edwards one bedstead, bed and furniture already received, also one bedstead, bed and furniture not received, also the following negroes namely Wmny, Cherry and Emilie already received, and Abby, Aggy one Copper not received, which I give her in her own right to dispose of as she may think proper.

5th. I give to my daughter Caroline Rawls one bedstead, bed and furniture already received, also one bedstead, bed and furniture not received; also the following negroes namely Jane and Cherry already received and I also leave to her for and during her life two other negroes namely Rose and Narcissus, and the future increase, and at her death I give the same to be equally divided among all her then living children -

6th. I leave to my son Albert Parker for and during his natural life, the land and plantation called the "Carr tract" lying on the North side of the road leading from South Dury to
