

Monroe ferry; said road being the Southern boundary line from the Cedar Swamp, and bounded by the land herein devised to Jefse Parker Junr. from the post at the ditch; also I leave him one bed and furniture, and the following negroes, naming, Lewis, Hannah, Nathan, Mariah, and Riddick, and the future increase of the females; the above named property to be left in the care of W^m M^r Jones, Jefse Parker Junr. & Adolphus St Jones, whom I hereby appoint as Curators with power to hire and rent out his negroes and land and take charge of his property herein devised to him, and dispose of it as his necessities require at their discretion, and should the said Alfred Parker die leaving a lawful child or children, then I give the property herein bequeathed to him, to his child or children if such there be, but if he should die leaving no child or children then I give all the said property to be equally divided among all my then living children except Martha Williams, yet the portion that would fall to the said Martha Williams I give to my grand daughter Mary Ella Williams (alias Mitty Williams) should she be living, if not to such of my other as be then living, except Martha Williams.

I give to my grand daughter Mary Ella Williams alias Mitty Williams two negroes named Jane and Cherry and their future increase which I leave in the care of my Executors until she arrives to the age of eighteen years; but should she die before she arrives to that age or without a child or children then the said negroes and the future increase thereof to be equally divided among all my then living children.

All the residue of my estate of what nature or kind soever I leave to be equally divided among all my children who may be living at the time of my death - the said Albert Parkers portion to be held in trust by my Curators as aforesaid.

Last I hereby nominate and appoint my friend W^m M^r Jones & Jefse Parker Junr. my lawful executors of this my last Will and Testament. On Wednesday whereby I have beenwⁿ 6th my hand seal the first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four.

At a Circuit Court held for the County of Southampton on the 2^d day of May 1857.

This last Will and Testament of Jefse Parker dec^d was this day proved by the oaths of William E. Gay, W^m P. Moore and Hardy Rawls the subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of W^m M^r Jones and Jefse Parker Junr. the executors therin named, who made oath and together with Joseph E Billots, William E Gay and Carr Bowers their subscribers (who justified and oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted the saids W^m M^r Jones & Jefse Parker Junr. for attesting a probate of the Will of the said Jefse Parker dec^d in due form.
