In the name of God. Amen. I Arthur W Holleman of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being of perfect sound mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following.

1<sup>st</sup> My will and desire is that my negro girl Charlotte and her child, and all my perishable estate except one ox, and all my land (lying on the North side of the road leading from Smithfield Isle of Wight County to Denwales Southampton County, called Broad Water or Smithfield Road) for the payment of my just debts & funeral expenses, a half acre of land at each grave yard excepted.

2<sup>dly</sup> After the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses as above mentioned I give Susanna Diggs, free negro, one hundred dollars in money, ten barrels corn, five hundred pounds bacon, and ten acres land, where her mother Pennina Diggs now resides, lying on the South side of the above named broad water or Smithfield road.

3<sup>rdly</sup> I give to Ann Eliza H. Diggs a mulatto girl daughter of the above named Susanna Diggs, all the balance of my land lying on the South side of the above named road my yellow ox named Buck and two hundred dollars in money.

4<sup>thly</sup> The remainder of my estate not heretofore named I wish equally divided one half of which I leave to my sister Lucy C. Preston during her life and at her death I wish it equally divided between her three youngest children named Joseph, James and Mary L. C. Preston. The other half I wish equally divided between my brother Henry A. Holleman and my nephew Richard A. Vick.

5<sup>thly</sup> In selling my land I wish the use of the Ice house reserved to my friend Julian J. Branch so long as he may choose to use it.

6<sup>thly</sup> and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Julian J. Branch of the County of Southampton my executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other & former wills or Testaments by me heretofore made.

At a Court<sup>t</sup> held for the County of Southampton on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of November 1857.
