To the County Clerk of Southampton County:

Your Commissioner reports to you that,

Anselm B. Wigham, the Administrator of John Wigham, has exhibited before him a Statement of all moneys received by the said Administrator, or with which he had become chargeable, or had disbursed, during the periods embraced in the foregoing account, together with the Vouchers in support of the disbursements. That he finds a balance of \$5732.53 to be due by the said adm^r. to the said Estate on the 15th day of November 1862. With interest on \$4034.96 from that day. That the said account is supported by satisfactory Vouchers, and that the said Administrator has given such bond as the Law requires. The penalty whereof and the securities thereof, are sufficient.
