1st In the name of God, Amen, I James Bister of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me at any anytime heretofore made.

1st I give unto my son James B. Bister the farm on which I live together with my still, Apple mill, Casks and all fixtures connected therewith to him and his heirs forever.

2nd I give unto my son Benjamin B. Bister my smaller tract of land known as the Bornei tract bounded on the west from my home tract by a line running N + S through my plum orchard to him and his heirs forever.

3rd After paying all debts and burial expenses, I give unto my daughters: viz: Martha J. the wife of John T. Oway, Victoria W. the wife of Ezra T. Gay, and Genialta J. the wife of Aquilla Raiford, after selling to the highest bidder, and the proceeds equally divided to them and their heirs forever. In testimony whereof, I hereunto affix my seal and sign this instrument as as my said will and testament this 18th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty two.
