forever.

And I do hereby utterly disallow and disavow all other wills or wills by me made, certifying and confirming this to
be my last Will and Testament. As witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date above

This last Will and Testament of Margaret P. Beale deceased and the bond thereto annexed were proved by the Notaries

affirmed with James D. Bryant and Joseph Joyner his securities, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty
of Two Thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs certifying he grants him for obtaining a probate of the said Will
in due form.

In the name of God amen. I Joseph Drury of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia do make and
for Drury's publish this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say.

Will Item 1st I lend unto my living wife Martha J. Drury the whole of my estate both real and personal during
her natural life or widowhood and it is further my will and desire that my children shall be raised out of the profits
of my estate as well as to be schooled out of the same, unless my Executor may consider the profits arising out of the
estate insufficient to raise and school them. Should that be the case it is my desire that my Executor shall expend
my money due my estate for that purpose.

Item 2nd. It is my will and desire that if my wife and Executor should think proper at any time after my death
make sale of my negro man Joe that it shall be as they conclude on, and should he be sold it is my desire the money
arising from the sale thereof to be loaned to my wife together with the balance of my estate on the condition as above
named.

Item 3rd. It is my will and desire in case of the death of either of my children before arriving at lawful age
