 named, Henry Johnson (son of Julius Johnson) to be raised out for the benefit of my Wife and Children until he ar-
 ives to the age of twenty one years, except the two last years I give to him, the balance of my personal Estate I give to

 on Mill Swamp, containing by estimation ninety acres, be the same, more or less, and at her death I give the said land
