This last will & testament of Henry Freeman aforesaid was proved by the oath of all the Witnesses thereto, and ordered
 to be recorded. And, There being no executor named in the said Will, on the motion of Oliver H. Freeman, who made oath,
 and, together with Samuel H. Hines and John M. H. Wells, his accountants, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the pen-
 nalty of one thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs to certify that he grants him for obtaining letters of adminis-
 tration on the estate of the said Henry Freeman decd, with his will annexed in due form.

In the name of God, amen! I Joseph S. Williams of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being
 (proclaiming) sick in body but of sound mind and memory, do make, ordain and constitute this to be my last Will and testament in
 this manner and form following: to wit - I do give and bequeath to my brother Richard S. Williams all my estate
 both real and personal subject to the sum of four thousand dollars to be paid by him to James M. Cooper if he should
 be the age of twenty one year, but if the said James Cooper should die before he should arrive at that age in that event I
 give the said sum of four thousand dollars to be paid to him the said James Cooper at that period to my brother
 Richard S. Williams to him and his heirs forever. Lasting - I do appoint my brother Richard S. Williams, my
 sole and sole executor of this my last Will and testament revoking all former Wills made by me. In Witness
 whereof I have set my hands and affixed my seal this seventh day of November one thousand eight hundred and
 thirty seven.

 therein named, who made oath, and, together with John B. Mason and Benjamin Williams, his accountants, entered into
 and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Twenty Five thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs, to cer-
 tify that he grants him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.
